The Ogdoad


4 pairs of primordial gods: Male frogs and female snakes

Huk / Huket = formlessness

Amun / Amunet = hiddenness / chaos / void

Kuk / Kuket = darkness

Nun / Naunet = the deep, primordial waters of Nun



Creation of Light

Day 1: God creates light, Gen. 1:3

Day 4: God creates sun, moon, and stars, Gen.

1:14-19

"The Egyptians believed that light was created by the elemental gods as they stood on the primeval hillock [Benben]... Significantly, it was only after that event that the gods 'gave birth to the sun-god." John Currid, Ancient Egypt and the Old Testament, 66.

Creation of Earth

Genesis 1:6-8

Then God said, "Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters." Thus God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament; and it was so. And God called the firmament Heaven. So the evening and the morning were the second day. (NKJV)

Dividing the Waters

Shu: Air, supporter of the heavens, holds up the sky

Tefnut: Moisture, dew, rain (sister-wife of Shu)

They give birth to Nut and Geb, sibling / consorts

Nut: The sky, the vault of heaven

Geb: the earth; Shu separates and holds Nut above Geb

Shu holding up the sky (Tutankhamen's tomb)




Netjer, Nature Deified


Man's Heart Is An Idol Factory

Red Sea = Adamic Sea

Goddess Ninhursag = "The Mother of All Living"
Genesis 3:20 "Adam named his wife Eve because she was the mother of all living"

Ninhursag had a daughter goddess named Ninti

Ninti = "Lady of the Rib"

Memories of Adam and Eve: Egyptian Links

- Atum ~ Adam? Ancestor worship of the first man
- Osiris and Isis
 - Chthonic deities: not elemental, distinctly human
 - Perfect husband and wife
 - King and queen of all creation on earth
 - Bringers of agriculture and civilization to humankind
- Seth
 - Opposed and murdered Osiris
 - Osiris was the first man to die, became King of the Dead

Memories of Adam and Eve: Fun with Names

Osiris = Oshir (Egypt) ~ Ashur (Mesopotamia) ~ Ish?

Mitzer (Egypt) ~ M'Oshir = "with Oshir"

Isis = Iset / Ishet (Egypt) ~ Ishtar (Meso.) ~ Ishe?

Seth = Set (Egypt) = Sata the serpent (Egypt) ~ Satan (Hebrew) ~~ Saturn? (Latin)

Horus: Hor of the Horizon, Unitor of the 2 Lands <u>Hor</u>izon, from *horos* in Greek

Proto-Evangelium

Genesis 3:14-15The Lord God said to the serpent...



Horus: King, the second Osiris


Isis was the most popular of all goddesses, to the common person due to her motherly compassion and merciful intercession for them

For thousands of years, people prayed through statues of Isis, holy mother of god, and her child Horus to invoke her motherly compassion that she would intercede on their behalf to her god-son












Man's Heart Is An Idol Factory
